6. Presentation – Belliveau House Committee

Diane Carmel Léger, Charline Landry, Patricia Utley and Bernard LeBlanc make a presentation to the council. They share details on the history of the Belliveau house, which dates back over 225 years, and its important role in local heritage. The building represents a symbol of Memramcook's cultural heritage and the

genealogical descent of one of the first Acadian families to settle in Memramcook. The committee proposes a number of options for preserving the building as a local tourist attraction. They refer to the success of neighbouring communities for similar projects, namely the Doiron house in Dieppe and the Pascal-Poirier historic house in Shediac.

Council members ask questions and share comments. The consensus of the council is to prepare a letter supporting the committee's efforts to preserve the building. It is noted that this project would fit well with the development of agritourism in Memramcook as well as the cultural policy adopted by the council.
